## GLASGOW — DAY 1 & 2

Glasgow is a port city on the River Clyde in Scotland's western Lowlands. It is famed for its Victorian and art nouveau architecture, a rich legacy of the city's 18th–20th century prosperity due to trade and shipbuilding. Today it is a national cultural hub, home to institutions including the Scottish Opera, the Scottish Ballet and the National Theatre of Scotland, as well as acclaimed museums and a thriving music scene. This is also a great staging area to the spectacular golf courses nearby: Loch Lomond and The Carrick to the north and Mar Hall along the River Clyde. There are also seven (7) distilleries in the area.

## TROON / PRESTWICK — DAY 3 & 4

Time to golf! We depart Glasgow and anchor in one of the bays off Troon or Prestwick to access some of the top golf courses in the area including Royal Troon, Prestwick and Turnberry, Irvine, Glasgow Gables and a myriad of others.



## CAMPBELTOWN — DAY 5

Anchored off the port in Campbeltown with access to three (3) distilleries: Springbank, Glen Scotia and Glendyle. Golf courses include the famous Machrihanish (1876) and Machrinanish Dunes golf course.



## ISLAY — DAY 6

Islay is the southernmost of the Inner Hebrides islands, off the west coast of Scotland. Along with the neighbouring island of Jura, it is known for its whisky. Numerous distilleries produce the island's characteristically peaty single malts. In the northeast, two (2) islands on Loch Finlaggan are dotted with the remains of an ancient settlement, including a prehistoric fort and medieval tombstones.

Additional suggestions for the area including visit Laphroaig, Laguvulin, Ardbeg, and Bowmore distilleries - there are a total of eight (8) distilleries on island. Visit St Columba, Port Charlotte, Port Ellen, Known for birdwatching. The Machrie Golf Links founded in 1891 offers spectacular golf along the coast.
